





The Right Reverend Dr. Greg K. Hargrave is the Senior Pastor of the Gospel Tabernacle United Holy Church of America, Inc. Burlington, NC for 36 years and 40 years in the ministry. He is the President of the Western North Carolina District which he oversees 32 churches. He is also the 2nd Vice President of the United Holy Church of America. International.

He attended the Jones School of Religion, Alamance and Davidson Community Colleges and is a 1994 Honor Graduate of the Winston-Salem State University with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing. - Presently in a capital campaign for a New Worship Center
- Currently leading an over four-million-dollar housing project on an 11-acre track that will provide affordable housing to many in the community

Bishop Hargrave is married to Minister Kim Hargrave for over 36 years. They are the proud parents of 3 beautiful daughters and 5 grandchildren. He and his family reside in Whitsett, NC.

Bishop Hargrave has received numerous awards, including certification for one of the most outstanding young men in America award, and the Diamond Award plaque for outstanding service toward the betterment of our country. He has served on every level of the church. In July 2004 he was elected to the office of 2nd Vice President of the Western North Carolina District. He was elevated to the First Assistant to the Bishop in October 2005. In May 2008 he was consecrated a Bishop in the United Holy Church of America's Quadrennial Convocation and in July 2008 was elected Vice President of the Western NC District. He was appointed the Bishop of Education in March 2009. He also served as Chairman of the Board of the Triad Christian Academy Greensboro, NC for over five years, and the Burlington Planning and Zoning Commission for seven years. In May 2016 Bishop Hargrave was elected to the position of 2nd Vice President of the United Holy Church of America, Inc and in July 2016, Bishop Hargrave was elected President of the Western North Carolina District.




















LOUISE BAGLEY, Candidate for General Financial Secretary

GENERAL ELECTION NEWS

The General Election Committee of the United Holy Church of America, Inc. (UHCA) is tasked with conducting the General Election on May 2, 2024 during the Quadrennial Convocation. During the recent General Convocation, May 2023, the house overwhelmingly voted to suspend our normal method of voting for the ratification of our Standard Manual from paper ballots to electronic voting, utilizing Election Buddy (a web-based system). The voting experience for those participating at the General Headquarters was successful. It provided the UHCA an opportunity to understand and actively engage in electronic voting. Overall, the process was a ground-breaking experience for the UHCA and highlighted our ability to embrace electronic voting.

Election Buddy allowed members to vote from any location at the headquarters site. Once each voter received a unique voter ID (which could only be used one time), they were able to cast their vote. Many were excited to vote from their device of choice (laptops, tablets, etc.) and were offered technical assistance, as needed. Votes were automatically tabulated.

During our recent mid-year conference, October 2-6, 2023, held near Raleigh the General Election Committee submitted a motion to the house to suspend the traditional method of voting via paper ballot and to use Election Buddy. The motion was approved and Election Buddy will be utilized for the upcoming General Election.

The voting process is simple. Members of the UHCA who will be voting on-site May 2, 2024, will receive notification by email and via a text message thirty- days before the date of voting, with detailed instructions. They will receive a second message with a reminder, 15 days before the election.

The General Election Committee (GEC) will make certain that no registered voter is disenfranchised due to: a lack of/ limited access to the internet, limited or no wi-fi connectivity, no cellphone, no tablet, no computer, or not being able to attend the Quadrennial Convocation in May 2024. Registered voters in these instances will request an absentee ballot when their membership registration list is submitted to their District President by December 15, 2023. Once submitted, they will receive an absentee ballot.

The Election Buddy voting system will manage paper ballots being mailed to members requesting an absentee paper ballot. Ballots must be postmarked by March 15, 2024, and should be returned to the GEC, postmarked by April 15, 2024, for their paper ballots to be valid.

In addition, the GEC will have a contingency plan in place should a natural disaster or health crisis such as COVID, cause an unforeseen disruption leading up to or during the election with the approval of the General Board of Elders and the General President.

Finally, using the Election Buddy electronic voting system is SECURE, reliable, and the cost is very reasonable. Additionally, it is used by several national organizations such as NAACP, COGIC and others. The quote for 1,000 voters is only \$90. Using this system would eliminate the need to print thousands of ballots and it would allow a cost savings which would eliminate the need for renting voting machines and purchasing supplies.

The General Election Committee is pleased to introduce electronic voting as a new method of voting in the UHCA for the Quadrennial Convocation General Election in May 2024. The UHCA would realize great cost savings and most importantly, all members who wish to participate in the voting process for the general church will be able to do so!














GENERAL MID-YEAR CONFERENCE

KEEPING THE STANDARD OF HOLINESS WITHOUT COMPROMISE








or get out of the pulpit; you must live holy".

In his message entitled "When I See Him" (Isaiah 6:1), he encouraged all to seek the power of the Holy Ghost that "dwells in the believer and keeps the believer from the power of sin." We must stop turning the altars into a place of performance. It is the holy place where we seek the Lord. Wednesday morning brought a powerful Hour of Power message from Elder Brenda McZeke from Monument of Faith in Marion, South Carolina. Because of this we should trust in the triune God and continue to stand in Holiness. In the Afternoon Session The General Music Department, led by UHCA Chief Minister of Music, Dr. Ron Bigelow presented an excellent Music Workshop with several presenters. UHCA Worship Leader, Minister Saiji Elder shared on Praise and Worship, saying that it is a form of prayer, communication of our faith, a calling, a ministry. The Worship Leader must be a person of prayer and of the Word and should be using scripture during praise and worship. Elder, Danny Lewis spoke the importance of a relationship between the pastor and minister of music. It is one of the most important ones in the church and must be in cadence. Minister, Rhonda Kelly. spoke on Creative Arts noting that it is scriptural, not just a filler but it's a time of worship. Both Brothers Dejuan Gardner and Milton Waters spoke on the preventive and correct maintenance of musical instruments and sound equipment and the need for musicians to be dedicated to the ministry. Minister of Music, Sis. Cheryl Woodard's topic was song selection. Music Directors are to seek God and ask for his guidance hear his voice in selecting appropriate music; know your audience and keep a balanced repertoire. Minister of Music, Bro. Maurice McIntyre spoke on Leading Youth and Young Adults. He noted the struggle of the youth and changing times, adding all songs should portray the Word













of God. He stated that you should not forget the foundation of our church, with is Hymns.

per usual, As Business of the Church was conducted during the Mid-Year Conference. Decisions pertaining to the 2024 UHCA General Election were made, and the use of Electronic Voting was approved for this Election. Further instructions have been circulated to the Presidents for District

implementation. The Election will take place during the 32nd UHCA Quadrennial Convocation on May 2, 2024. We also met the candidates; information about the Slate of Officers will be included in this Holiness Union. The release of the newly ratified UHCA Standard Manual will begin in 2024 with the electronic version. A hardback edition will be available once a publisher is secured. Information on the Retirement Celebration Gala for our outgoing Presiding Prelate was announced during this Session. The event will take place on May 4, 2024. Further details are also included in this issue.

The Session Concluding brought a spoken word from Bishop Jeffrey Gravely of the Western North Carolina District (Chestnut Progressive Ridge Primitive Baptist Church). His subject: A Strong Savior In The Midst of a Sick Society and Weak Saints/The Perfect Foundation (Luke 9:37-40). The father met the disciples, seeking deliverance for his son's issues. But the disciples lacked the power to help them. Today the world has brought their problems to the church looking for help but instead they have found weak saints. Before we can speak of holding up the standard of holiness without compromise, we have to make sure that we have not been compromised. He encouraged the growth of faith, noting that the



doctrinal foundation of the church is strong; the gates of hell cannot prevail against it.

The last session was also a time of recognition and appreciation During this Mid-Year Conference the First Session the UHCA Episcopal Academy, specialized training for Newly Consecrated Bishops and Bishop-Designates place. Instructors included Dr. William Turner, Bishop

Elijah Williams, Bishop Johnnie Felton, Bishop Clifton Buckhram and Elder Latelia Fountain. Certificates of Completion were presented to the first recipients Bishop-Designate Marvin Lackett (West Virginia District), Bishop-Designate Brian McKnight (South Carolina District), Bishop-Fitzpatrick Kirten (Barbados District), Bishop-Designate Michael Clemmons (Northwestern District) and Bishop-Designate Thomas Williams (New England District). The session concluded with Special Thanks and Presentations to our most gracious hosts, Dr. James P. Perkins and the wonderful members of Victory Tabernacle Church. We

will not forget the outstanding hospitality, the excellent food service, the spirit of kindness and the open-door policy that permeated our time at Victory Tabernacle. We are forever in their debt.

Stay tuned for plans concerning the upcoming events for 2024 beginning with the Bishops Council (March 4-6), the General Education Conference (March 6-8) and the 32nd Quadrennial Convocation of The United Holy Church of America, Inc. (April 29-May 5), all to be held at the General Headquarter in Greensboro, North Carolina.

Remembering the Life & Legacy of our **General Father** Bishop Jesse Jones

On November 14, 2023, Bishop Jesse Jones entered eternal rest peacefully in his home surrounded by his loved ones. Bishop Jones, a great "Man of God" was born to the late Mack Swinton and Rosa Jones Scott. on December 28, 1932, in Nesmith, South Carolina. He took his commitment to family and to the Lord very seriously and the church became an essential part of his life.

Bishop Jones was educated in the Williamsburg County School System in Nesmith, South Carolina. If you knew Bishop Jones, then you know he loved education and learning.

After high school, he planned to travel and settle in California to pursue his dream of becoming a physician. Unbeknownst to him he would stumble across the graceful Irene James who captivated his heart. Rather than boarding the train, he decided to remain on the tracks of love. The two married on April 8, 1950, and settled in Durham, North Carolina.

From this union, four beautiful daughters were born: Rosa, Arlene, Pamela, and Shirrell.

Bishop Jones continued his education at Durham Technical College, majoring in Electronics. He later graduated from Shaw University's Minister's Continuing Education and furthered his studies at Shaw

University Seminary Without Walls. He also attended Duke University Divinity School and Virginia Union University School of Theology. He later began a career at Carolina Supply Company as a Biomedical Equipment Technician where he retired after 48 years of service.

Called to ministry at the age of 19, Bishop Jones dedicated his life to serving God's Church,

his community, and mentoring youth. He pastored at White Rock United

Holy Church in Chapel Hill, North

Carolina for 21 years. On May 5, 1978, he was consecrated to the Episcopacy in Hamilton, Bermuda. He also pastored at St. John United Holy Church in Zebulon, North Carolina where he was a faithful servant for 52 years before retiring. Bishop Jones maintained membership at Fisher Memorial United Holy Church in Durham, North Carolina for 50 + years.

Bishop Jones was very active

many civic and religious organizations. He served as a past President of the Western North Carolina District Convocation, and he is past President of the Southern District Convocation-Henderson, North Carolina,. He received an Apostolic Appointment with the United Holy Church of America Incorporated. In 1984, he was recognized by North Carolina Governor James "Jim" B. Hunt for the highest award for community service — "The Order of The Long Leaf Pine". In April 1985, he became a Life Member of Sertoma International. On May 7, 2002, he received a commendation for his Dedication and Sacrificial service to the Affairs of the United Holy Church of America, Inc. and for Outstanding Achievement and Leadership demonstrated by Exceptional Progress and Development in the United Holy Church Christian Academy. In 2008 and 2014, he was given the "Key to the City" in Durham, North Carolina for community service by Mayor William "Bill" Bell. Because of his exemplary service to the United Holy Church of America,

Incorporated, on February 24, 2016, Bishop Jones was awarded the degree of Honorary Doctorate by United Christian College of The Southern District Convocation of the United Holy Church of America, Incorporated.

Bishop Jones' love for the community was evident in the many projects he led. In 2012, Bishop Jones inspired and

















led his district to purchase 25 acres at a cost of \$100,000 (now mortgage-free) to build a headquarters building for the Southern District Convocation – Henderson, North Carolina. He also guided leadership to acquire the funds and served as one of the primary negotiators for the acquisition of the United Holy Church of America's Headquarters building in Greensboro, North Carolina. He was appointed Bishop over the United Holy Church of America Christian Academy and served as Chairman of the Board of Directors. The school was later named, Triad Christian Academy.

An advocate of education and the progress of young people, Bishop Jones was a great supporter of programs and projects that enhanced the Church, the Community, and the lives of others. He supported the ministry of others who had been called to Kingdom building. Bishop Jones was a godly man worthy of honor and his service to the United Holy Church continued as he accepted the appointment as a Senior Advisor to the General President in October 2016. In October 2018 at the Mid-Year Conference in Greensboro, North Carolina, he graciously received his highest

honor with the acceptance of the position of General Father of The United Holy Church of America, Inc., which he held until his passing.

Bishop Jones was an outstanding man of God, chosen by God, and was committed to his calling. He served the body of Christ under the umbrella of The United Holy Church of America, Incorporated as a preacher, evangelist, pastor, leader, servant of the church, visionary, and trailblazer for many years. He continued to preach and teach the gospel of Jesus Christ under the anointing of the Holy Spirit with zeal, compassion, and love even in his last days, sharing a word and his life-learnings with his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. His favorite Bible verse is John 3:16, which reads, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have eternal life."

Bishop Jones had a very special bond with his family. Preceding his death were his parents, Mack Swinton and Rosa Jones Scott, wife, the late Reverend Irene James Jones, sister, Bertha Scott Rush, daughters, Arlene "Frances" Wiggins, and Shirrell Lynette Jones. He leaves a legacy of love, strength, and precious memories to: his two daughters: Rosa J. Nolen and Pamela L. Grafton; ten grandchildren: Dana Hopkins (Curtis), Charmaine Grafton, Cyrena Grafton, Shameya Grafton, Jennifer Wiggins, Donald Nolen, Jr., Algernon Monroe, Jr., Jesse Monroe, Canaan Dale, and Caleb Dale and twelve great-grandchildren: Jonathan Partlow, II, Airmen 1st Class Makaylah Mbofana, Sydney Kennedy, Makayah Mbofana, Kaitlyn Hopkins, Ena Kennedy, Prentice Long, Jumuah Long, Courtney Crudup, Kyrie Hawley-Monroe, Keilian Hawley-Monroe, and Jayla Monroe; sister's-nlaw: Margarie James, Patricia Blanks and Mary Evans; brother-n-law: Frederick James: and a host of extended family, friends, and the United Holy Church of America, Inc. 
Brother Robert L. Rollins

In 1957 Mother Bennett gave her heart to the Lord, and a year later on an Easter Sunday she joined Bethel Pentecostal Church and became an active member.


She served as President of the Missionary Department and held the positions of Sunday


